

TO ENROLL IN PROPEL, PARTICIPANTS MUST MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- Within 1-9 months of their scheduled release date.
- Returning to the 7 county metro area (Hennepin, Ramsey, Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Scott, Washington counties).
- Currently incarcerated at a participating state or county correctional facility – OR – on Work Release or Educational Release within 1-9 months of SRD.
- Interested in securing meaningful employment post-release.

SUCCESS

All ProPEL participants have the opportunity to access paid training and career opportunities designed to help you move forward quickly. Men and women active in ProPEL have completed education, found employment, built careers, and stabilized their families (fewer than 12% of ProPEL participants have been reincarcerated or violated conditions of release). Project ProPEL will help you get started with what comes after incarceration.
